What is the Long Term Athlete Development Model and Active Start?

LTAD is an inclusive model that encourages individuals to get involved in lifelong physical activity and sport. The Active Start stage is the first of seven stages of LTAD which focuses on children from under the age of six. It recognizes that physical activity is essential for healthy child development and encourages physical literacy, which gives children the tools they need to take part in physical activity and sport, both for healthy life-long enjoyment and sporting success by developing fundamental movement skills and linking them together into play.
